
A special thank you to everyone for maintaining The Locke School uniform policy. Wearing uniforms everyday helps to establish a unified identity and serves as a reminder of our shared purpose. Uniform shirts, sweaters and pants also help us to keep the focus on learning at the Locke School. They help to minimize distractions and competitions among children related to fashion and "sought after" brands.

Uniform shirts with the school logo are now available on the COOKIES website. Please see Monika Vargas for more information on ordering. Because of the ordering delay, navy blue polo shirts without the school logo will continue accepted as school uniform shirts. As the weather gets colder, families are encouraged to purchase the hoodies and sweaters with The Locke School logo, which are also available on the Cookies website. If families do not have sweaters with the school logo, students can wear any navy blue sweater or hoodie over their uniform shirt or a solid color long sleeve T-shirt under their uniform shirt. We ask that any extra shirts and sweaters worn for warmth do not have designs, advertisements or brand logos printed on them.

Students at the Locke school should wear their uniforms to school every day. Students who do not wear their uniforms to school will be provided with a 'loaner' shirt for the day. These loaner shirts are laundered weekly by volunteers.
